Introduction:

Term One and Two

Disproportionate allocation of resources in the world results in whole communities being denied access to basic human needs of food, shelter and clothing, and whose standard of living is far below those of the developed world. Overuse of resources and unrestrained industrialisation in developing countries are responsible not only for inequity, but also for unsustainable production and wastage, ultimately leading to world food insecurity, and environmental degradation. This is a global issue and requires a global response. Individuals, families and communities in developed countries need to be aware of the response required to enhance the living environment, manage change, and support global community wellbeing.

Students examine the ethical and sustainability issues associated with food production and textiles manufacture. This unit allows students to develop understandings of the impact of decision making on food security, as well as explore the social practices related to the clothing and textiles industry that run counter to the well-being of the consumer and global communities. Students will be confronted with the rights and responsibilities of 'global citizenship' and what it means to 'activate change' in contrast to 'passive participation'.
